The Ius study programme prepares students for practical fields of activity in professions that practice the application of law. In particular, these occupations include:

- Legal practitioner at European institutions,
 - Commercial jurist,
 - Legal practitioner at NPOs,
 - Insurance jurist,
 - Banking jurist,
 - Municipal jurist,
 - Conflict manager
- and much more.

A wide range of job prospects for demanding occupations open up in these areas, where juridical knowledge is in high demand in conjunction with concise argumentation skills.

With a degree in Ius, graduates can apply for legal positions that are not exclusively addressed to fully qualified lawyers. Suitable fields of activity exist on the economy, in public administrations, as well as in organisations and unions. The competencies gained in this study programme are even in demand in fields that go beyond classical juridical occupations, such as journalism or political consulting.

Graduates have the opportunity to begin a consecutive master's degree programme in law and earn a *Master of Laws (LL.M.)*. After earning a master's degree, a PhD may be pursued. Graduates of the study programme are awarded the academic degree *Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.)*.

Berlin School of Economics and Law



The Berlin School of Economics and Law (BSEL) is one of the largest Universities of Applied Sciences in the city. It has an academic staff of 190 professors and approximately 770 lecturers, plus nearly 240 research and administrative personnel, committed to realising about 50 study programmes.

Curriculum

The Bachelor study has 6 semester. In the fourth semester a 26-week period of work placement is done.

Languages of instruction

Most courses and lectures are held in German, although some are held in English.

Degree

Graduates will be awarded the academic degree *Bachelor of Law (LL.B.)*.

Fee

There are no tuition fees on this programme as it is funded through public grants. Students are required to pay a semester fee. The semester fee includes a contribution to the Studentenwerk Berlin, the student representative body as well as the enrolment and administration fee and a semester season ticket for the local public transport systems. Contents

Students are taught by professors of the three traditional main subjects, experts on civil law, public law and criminal law in lectures, departmental classes, exercises and seminars comprising small study groups.

Graduates have applicable knowledge in the areas of:

- ▮ civil law,
- ▮ material European law,
- ▮ national and constitutional law,
- ▮ trade and economic law,
- ▮ criminal law and administrative law,
- ▮ fundamentals of the corresponding process procedures and codes of practice.

They have a command of the national and supranational juridical methodology needed for the analysis of facts and legal matters, dispose of communicative and social competencies, and are able to discuss legal problems in English.

The study programme is designed to make external prep courses unnecessary.

Admission

General requirements

- General university entrance certificate or
- technical college entrance qualification or
- subject-related qualification as stipulated by § 11 Berlin legislation governing higher education
- Foreign applicants: German language university entrance exam for foreign students
