Master's Programme in International Security Management

An interdisciplinary course that combines security-related disciplines, drawn from the Legal, Social and Political Sciences, Information Technology and Economics.

Degree	Master of Arts (M.A), 120 ECTS credit points	
Objectives & Content	Security is a crucial topic for private and public actors, including business, governments and NGOs, and has both national and international dimensions. The M.A. International Security Management aims to prepare students for careers in international security management by helping them to develop the critical interdisciplinary understanding and practically oriented skills relevant for an evolving and fast-paced industry.	
Organisation	The M.A. International Security Management begins in April and takes place over four academic semesters (2 years), Students will usually spend Semester 3 undertaking an internship. The M.A. programme is taught entirely in English.	
Admission Requirements	 An internationally recognised undergraduate degree (Bachelor, Diploma), with at least 180 ECTS credit points Very good knowledge of English (equivalent to higher Level B2 of Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for Languages), we highly recommend C1. CV and letter of motivation 	
Fees	There are no tuition fees for this programme. Students are required to pay a semester fee for each semester of study. The semester fee includes a ticket for Berlin public transport.
