

## Erasmus+ Short Term 'Blended' Mobility

### Funding rates:

- **Daily allowance for event days**  
→ 79 EUR up to the 14th day of mobility, 56 EUR from the 15th day onwards
- **Daily allowance for travel days**  
→ 79 EUR per travel day (travel day = arrival and/or departure day outside the event period) for up to two days for standard travel and up to six days for green travel
- Additional funding opportunities for **sustainable travel 'Green Travel'** and **'students with fewer opportunities'** (supplementary lump sums or actual costs in the case of a successful actual cost application)
- **Travel allowance**

Travel distance	Standard travel	Green Travel
10 to 99 km	28 EUR	56
100 to 499 km	211	285
500 to 1999 km	309 EUR	417
2000 to 2999 km	395 EUR	535

## Additional subsidies for sustainable travel "Green Travel"\*

### Green Travel

Higher travel allowance: **€417** total for round trip (instead of €309 for non-sustainable travel)

+ For the additional time required for outward and return journeys when travelling by environmentally friendly, 'green' means of transport, you can receive up to 4 additional daily travel allowances (79) depending on the distance to your destination and your actual travel time (according to the Erasmus Distance Calculator):

Distance up to 1000 km = 1 additional daily travel allowance

Distance 1000-1500 km and more than 8 hours (green travel) travel time per leg = up to 2 additional travel allowances (less than 8 hours travel time 1 additional travel allowance)

Distance 1500-2000 km and more than 16 hours (green travel) travel time per route = up to 3 additional travel allowances (under 16 hours travel time 1 or 2 additional travel allowances)

Distance over 2000 km and more than 24 hours (green travel) Travel time per route = up to 4 additional daily travel allowances (under 24 hours travel time 1, 2 or 3 daily travel allowances)

#### Prerequisite:

- At least 50% of the journey to and from the place of study abroad is made using more environmentally friendly means of transport, such as train, bus, bicycle or carpooling

#### Proof:

- Submission of a sworn statement together with the Grant Agreement
- Retention of supporting documents (e.g. train ticket) and provision of these upon request  
→ If you apply for additional 'green travel' funding but are unable to provide evidence upon request that you travelled using sustainable means of transport, you must repay the additional funding to the university.

## **Additional funding for Students with fewer opportunities**

### **Students with chronic illnesses**

→ **Top-up of €100**

Requirements:

- Chronic illness with additional financial needs abroad

Proof:

- Submission of a sworn statement together with the Grant Agreement
- Retention of supporting documents (e.g. medical certificate confirming that the chronic illness in question results in additional financial requirements abroad) and provision of these upon request

### **Students with disabilities (from GdB 20)**

→ **Top-up of €100**

Requirement:

- Degree of disability of 20 or more
- Or students with a proven disability that results in additional financial needs

Proof:

- Submission of a sworn statement together with the Grant Agreement
- Retention of evidence (e.g. severely disabled person's pass, notification from the regional social welfare office or medical certificate) and provision of this upon request
- A medical certificate/report confirming that the disability results in additional financial needs and provision of this upon request

### **Students with children**

→ **Top-up of €100**

Prerequisite:

- At least one child is taken along for the entire stay abroad
- Amount independent of the number of children

Proof

- Submission of a sworn statement together with the Grant Agreement
- Retention of evidence (e.g. travel documents and child's birth certificate) and provision of this upon request

## Working students

### → Top-up of €100

#### Prerequisite:

- The employment must have been carried out continuously for at least six months within the last 12 months prior to the start of the study abroad programme.
- The employment in the country of origin must not be continued during the stay abroad (this also includes mobile working, online working, paid leave, etc.). Termination of employment is not a requirement; the employment contract can also be paused.
- During the minimum period of employment prior to application, monthly earnings must be between €450 and €850 (net earnings from all activities per month added together).
- As a rule, self-employed activities and dual/part-time courses of study with a fixed salary are excluded.

#### Proof:

- Submission of a sworn statement with the Grant Agreement
- Retention of evidence (e.g. written proof of termination or suspension of employment) and provision of this upon request

## First-generation students

### → Top-up of €100

#### Requirement:

- Neither parent nor guardian has a degree from a university or university of applied sciences
- A degree from a vocational academy that leads to a qualification comparable to a university degree is considered an academic degree. A master craftsman's certificate is not equivalent to an academic degree in this context.
- Degrees completed abroad by a parent that are not recognised as such in Germany (e.g. physiotherapy) are considered academic degrees within the framework of the eligibility criteria for receiving additional funding, meaning that there is no entitlement to the top-up amount.

#### Proof:

- Submission of a sworn statement together with the Grant Agreement
- Retention and provision of relevant evidence upon request

→ If you apply for additional funding on the basis of 'lower chances' but are unable to prove on request that you are eligible for such funding, you must repay the additional funding amounts to the university.

**Important note:** It is not possible to combine two different top-ups for students with fewer opportunities. However, it is possible to combine 'Green Travel' and additional funding for students with fewer opportunities.
