Requirements

- Mandatory Participation in the meetings

Internship Report

- Evaluation and reflection on your work experience
- Length: 10-15 pages (plus references)
- Presenting your employer (e.g. NGO, national or international institution or a company)
- Your task, responsibilities and functions (according to the job description)
- Specific outcomes (preparing a publication, finalising a project, creating a product or a service...) or contribution to the institution or company.

Reflection (1) Anticipation and Reality

- What did you expect and hope for in terms of
 - Tasks
 - Sovereignty to work
 - Supervision by superiors
 - Co-operation with colleagues
 - About the employer
- Where your expectations matched? If not, in which areas did you identify a gap?
- Did this gap change your perception about the internship or the institution/company?

Reflection (2) Tasks and Supervision

- Have you been under- or over-challenged by the tasks or had the tasks been right in terms of requirements and responsibility?
 - What did you learn during the internship (in terms of substance, working processes, the big picture)?
 - How was the supervision? To what extent did supervision enable you to perform well? Which additional measures would have improved your performance?
 - Did you get a qualified feed-back from your superiors?
- Would you assess your work as useful (for the institution/company and society in a broader perspective)?
- If you could change something: What would you like to change and why?

Reflection (3) Working Climate and Colleagues

- Have you been integrated into the working environment?
 - Have you been accepted by your colleagues?
 - Had there been conflicts or any other issues which had a detriment effect on your contribution?
 - How was the relationship between staff -including the representation of staff by workers councils and trade unionsand supervisors in general?
 - How was your own relationship with your supervisor?
 - What is your impression about the institutional / corporate climate?
- If you could change something: What would you like to change and why?

Reflection (4) Self Assessment and Link to Studies

- Did you meet the institution's/company's demands and if not, why not?
- To what extent deepened the internship your understanding of topics of your studies?
- To what extent has the internship contributed to your career (master thesis topic, network,...)
- If you could change something: What would you like to change and why?
- If you could perform a leap in time and jump back one year: Would you do the same things you did?
- Would you recommend the institution/company as an employer for internships of other students? If yes, why? If not, why not?
